Junior Rangers Club

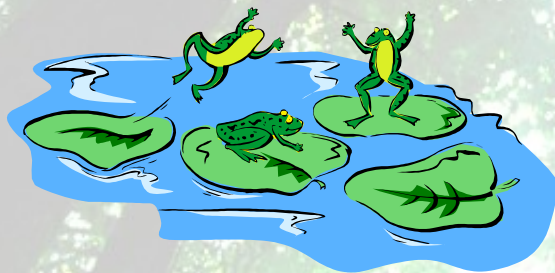


Are you aged between 8 and 11 years old? Are you interested in British wildlife and want to know what you can do to help it?

Why not join North East Wales Wildlife's Junior Rangers Club. As a Junior Ranger you will be given the chance to explore your local nature reserve and find out exactly who lives there. Experienced staff will be on hand to guide you through the sessions. You will get to make new friends and have fun whilst playing games and taking part in activities such as pond dipping and animal tracking.

North East Wales Wildlife have lots of experience in running school and community education sessions for people of all ages. They own or look after 12 reserves around North East Wales and have a very good local reputation for Amphibian conservation.

The club will run on the last Wednesday of every month after school between 4pm and 5.30pm at Rhydymwyn Valley Nature Reserve, just outside of Mold. This nature reserve is fully equipped with indoor facilities complete with toilets and a kitchen. Rhydymwyn Valley Nature Reserve is a fascinating reserve full of wildlife and history combined.



Rhydymwyn Valley Nature Reserve is an old World War 2 munitions factory that is now home to over 8 species of bat, badgers, foxes, Great Crested Newts, Buzzards and much, much more. There will be plenty of opportunity to explore this site as a Junior Ranger and find out what NEWW are doing to help the wildlife that can be found there.

There is a small charge when signing up as a Junior Ranger which will pay for an annual trip during the summer, offsite to visit other local nature reserves in the area.
